








Located in Murfreesboro, just south of Nashville, Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) has the largest undergraduate enrollment in Tennessee. Admissions Requirements

International applicants are evaluated for admission based on the following criteria:

Academic performance

English language proficiency

Undergraduate

An official language score with minimum TOEFL iBT score of 61; paper-based, 500; IELTS 5.5; ITEP 3.6. MTSU also accepts UMELI scores or completion of ELS level 110.

Graduate

An official language score with minimum TOEFL iBT score of 71; paper-based 525; IELTS 6.0. MTSU also accepts UMELI scores or completion of ELS level 112.

Standardized tests

Undergraduate

An official ACT minimum score of 22 or an SAT score of 1,020.

Graduate

An acceptable GRE or GMAT score may be required for some graduate programs.

- All international applicants must document sources of financial support.
- Proof of medical vaccines for MMR, varicella, tuberculosis, etc.

Scholarships and Employment

- MTSU awards merit-based international scholarships of \$2,000, \$5,000, and \$12,000 annually to new first-year, transfer, and graduate students with a 3.25 GPA or above. Applicants are automatically considered upon submission of an application. These scholarships are renewable annually.

The College of Graduate Studies



- MTSU's James E. Walker Library holds over one million volumes and provides information, resources, and instructional services to meet the needs of students, faculty, staff, and researchers. There are numerous other discipline-specific libraries and archives on campus.
- All students have University email accounts and unlimited internet access. There are six University computer labs on campus, and all residence halls have internet access.
- The beautiful main campus covers more than 500 acres and has over 200 buildings.
- The Aerospace Department has a 40-plane fleet and one of the most advanced air traffic control simulators in the U.S.

- The College of Mass Communication includes the nation's largest department of recording industry and the new Center for Innovation in Media.
